

Moving Medicine: Project Lead. Expressions of Interest

The Faculty of Sport and Exercise Medicine(FSEM) are inviting expressions of interest for a new design lead for the Moving medicine project. The successful applicant will work within the Moving Medicine team with the support of the Faculty Moving Medicine Project Lead and will be responsible for delivering the objectives of the Moving Medicine project.

Background: In October 2018, the Secretary of State for Health launched Moving Medicine on behalf of the Faculty of Sport and Exercise Medicine(FSEM) in partnership with Public Health England and Sport England.

This organisation is working to spread the word about the positive effects of physical activity for the prevention and treatment of disease. In partnership with the Royal College of Physicians, the Royal College of General Practitioners, the Royal College of Nursing and the Chartered Society of Physiotherapists as well as the Royal College of Psychiatrists and a large number of Colleges, Faculties and Charitable organisations, the Faculty of Sport and Exercise medicine have produced a series of clinician facing resources with the purpose of giving clinicians, of all disciplines and specialties, the skills and knowledge to have impactful conversations with patients about physical activity.

Job Description:

The successful applicant will work as a contractor to FSEM on a sessional basis at a rate of £18,000 per annum with a likelihood of increasing hours in the future if desired.

The existing Central Moving Medicine Team is made up of FSEM Council Project Lead(honorary), Project Manager and Administrator, Active Hospital Consultant Lead, International Development and Design Lead, and FSEM PR and Communications Manager. The project is supported by the FSEM, SEM Specialist Registrars and an expanding team of partners and ambassadors. The team also comprises project leads for each existing and each new disease area.

Key Objectives of the Moving Medicine Project for 2019-20:

1. Dissemination of Moving Medicine resources through targeted media, social media campaign
2. Dissemination of Moving Medicine Resources through conference programmes and journals
3. Process evaluation of Moving medicine resource through IT analytics and case studies
4. Development and administration of online supported educational resources in partnership with Academy for Health Coaching
5. Support for teams developing new modules including 'Back to work after pregnancy' module, morbid pregnancy module, Gastroenterology module, peri-operative care module and potential Paediatric diseases modules
6. Updates to existing and new modules through a supported SPR programme
7. Developing and supporting Regional networks of ambassadors



Key objectives for this role:

1. To develop a new moving medicine platform for paediatrics across 6 disease areas
2. To work with project groups and stakeholders to develop resources within existing frameworks
3. To support the priorities of the project set out above
